

A "History Note" from Arthur K. Sudler, Director St. Thomas Historical Society and Archives

REPRESENTATION MATTERS

Today will mark the 228th time that the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas has held an election for parish vestry. Founders William Gray, Henry Stewart, and James Oronoko Dexter were on the first vestry elected in 1796. So was a young James Forter But it is only the 158th time that St. Thomas has been able to elect representatives to the annual diocesan convention, or that St. Thomas clergy can "sit in Convention." A "guid pro guo" established between the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania and St. Thomas in 1795, known as "the eighth revised regulation", guaranteed that Absalom Jones, as a candidate for ordination, would be exempt from the canonically required ordination examination in Greek and Latin - so long as – it is understood that "the African Church" is not entitled "to send a Clergyman or Deputies to the Convention, or to interfere with the general government of the Episcopal Church, this condition being made in consideration of their peculiar circumstances at present." The condition made in consideration of the peculiar circumstances at present continued for seventy years - long after St. Thomas, in 1834, called as rector, The Rev. William Douglass, an ordained minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church who Bishop William White ordained as an Episcopal priest. Fr. Douglass possessed a classical education and was "learned in Greek and Latin." He served St. Thomas until his death in 1862. But neither he, nor wealthy successful businessman, and longtime vestryman, James Forten, ever attended the annual diocesan convention.

Forten, largely responsible for recruiting Douglass, likely thought Douglass' background would overcome the prohibition on diocesan convention participation. Seemingly, it was not until 1849, the year after Forten's death, that St. Thomas sent a formal petition to the Diocese seeking to repeal the eighth revised regulation. The petition was referred to a committee. The membership of the committee is unclear but the majority report - which opposed admitting St. Thomas - was written by George Mifflin Wharton grandfather of a future U.S. Senator from Pennsylvania George Wharton Pepper, Esquire, founder of the law firm of Pepper Hamilton which merged in 2020 with Troutman Sanders becoming Troutman Pepper. Wharton wrote that the prohibition stemmed from the color of the congregants, their political and social condition, and their defects of education and cultivation all of which resulted in their "consequent unfitness" for participating in the governance of the Church. The minority opinion - which supported the admission of St. Thomas - was written by The Rev. Fr. Henry E. Montgomery. Diocesan Convention in 1850 voted to continue to exclude St. Thomas. The clergy vote was 44 to 42. The lay delegations voted 51 to 16 with one delegation divided on the question. The fact that the laity was overwhelmingly opposed to admitting St. Thomas is not surprising given that anti-Black racial violence had beset Philadelphia since 1829 and the city's pro-slavery/pro-Southern sympathies earned it the reputation of being the northern city most hostile to African Americans. It is likely that this battle for voice and vote in ecclesiastical affairs was instructive and inspiriational to our heroic martyred vestryman Octavius V. Catto who would represent St. Thomas in diocesan convention in 1870 and also fight for the right to vote in the secular realm. St. Thomas' Octavius V. Catto Voter Education Ministry reminds us all that "representation matters."
