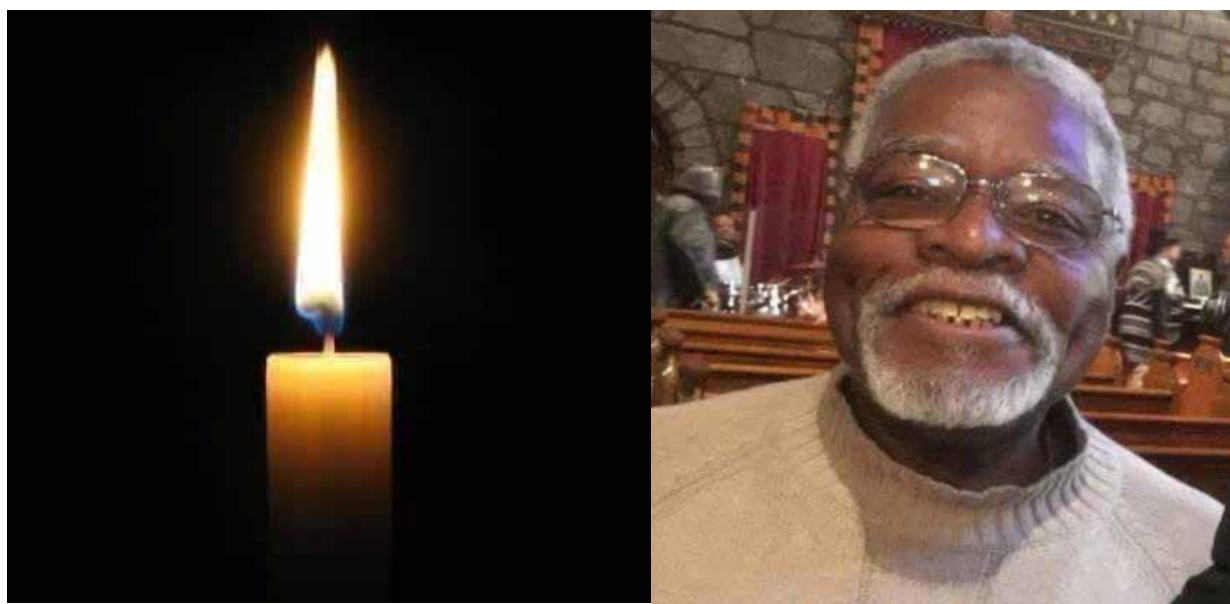
FROM THE DESK OF THE RECTOR:

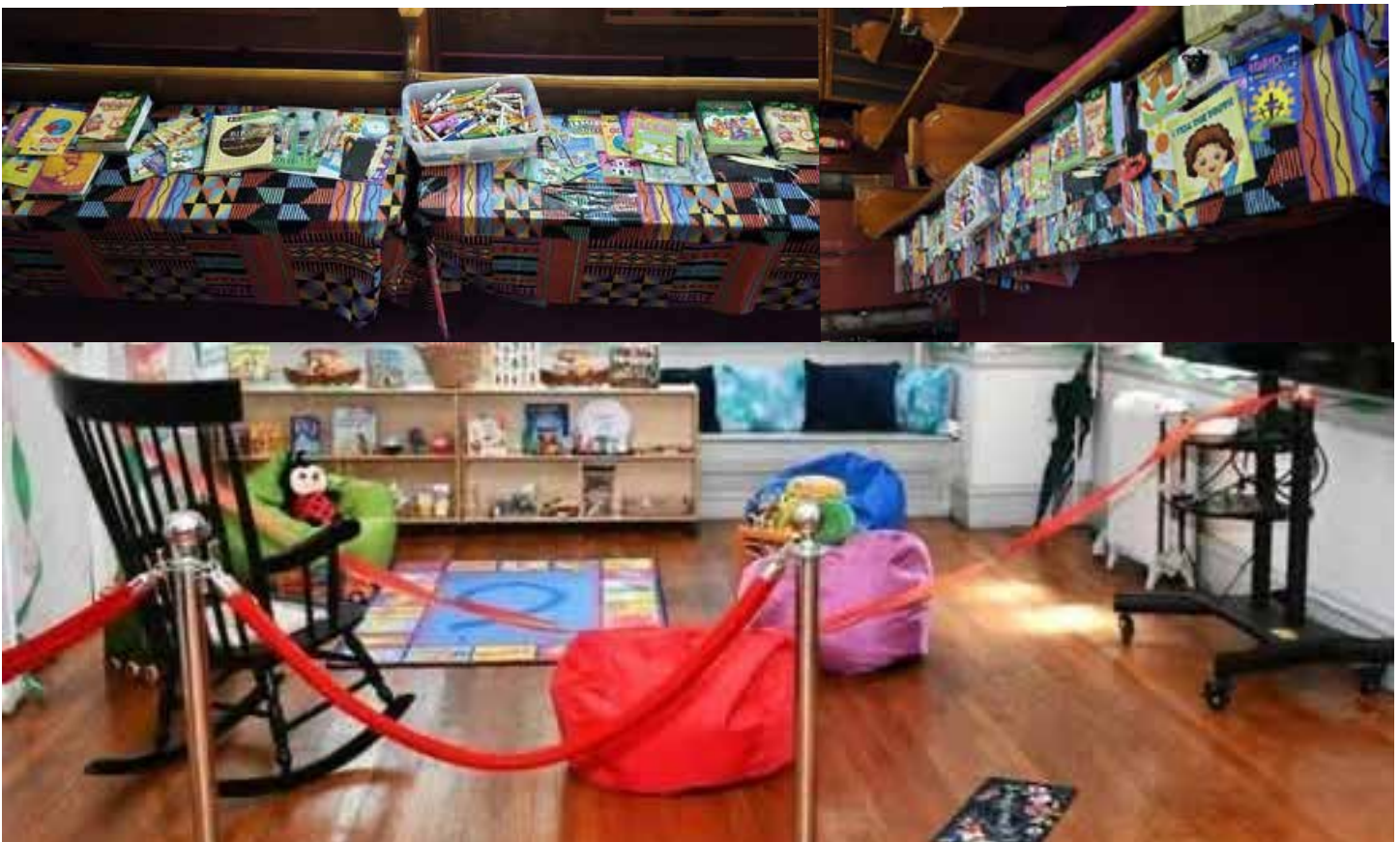
SUMMER CHILDREN'S MINISTRY ANNOUNCEMENT ATTENTION ALL FAMILIES!!
