



Attention!! Attention!! Your Vote Matters!! Come Join the Catto Ministry

We hope that the Summer is going well for you and yours. The Octavius V. Catto Voter Education Ministry is a non-partisan ministry that honors the legacy of Octavius Catto, who was a member of St. Thomas, a civil rights activist who registered Black men to vote, spearheaded the effort to integraterolley cars in Philadelphia and accomplished so much more.

He was murdered after voting on Election Day October 10, 1871, by an angry mob who didn't want Black men to vote.

The objective of the Catto Ministry is to provide Voter Education and to promote civic engagement. You may have heard that during the Spring 2023, we focused our efforts on the Philadelphia Primary - the Road to the Primary VOTING WITH PURPOSE -- by (1) fifteen members of St. Thomas participated in the Mayoral Forum hosted by POWER Interfaith and joined more than 700 members from more than 40 churches [the largest gathering to hear Mayoral candidates]; (2) hosted a forum where we learned about the responsibilities of the City Controller as well as the City Commissioner; (3) hosted a forum where we heard from judicial candidates about the duties of judges; (4) hosted a forum where we learned about the Mayor's responsibilities for a \$6 Billion dollar budget; how to fill out a mail-in ballot correctly; and the opportunity to practice using the new electronic poll book for in-person

voting; discussed the ballot questions; and (5) developed and distributed a voter's guide about which positions were on the ballot and the responsibilities of each office, ballot questions, etc.

Exciting activities are planned and we want you to join us with your ideas, and enthusiasm, bring a friend or two, to be an integral part of this crucial ministry for members of St. Thomas and for our community.
