WHAT IS ROSE OR LAETARE SUNDAY

Rose or Laetare Sunday is the fourth Sunday in the season of Lent., in the Western Christian liturgical calendar. Traditionally, this Sunday had been a day of celebration, within the austere period of Lent. This Sunday gets its name from the first few words (incipit) of the traditional Latin entrance (Introit) for the Mass of the day. "Laetare Jerusalem" (Rejoice, O Jerusalem") is Latin from Isaiah 66:10

Flowers may appear on the high altar. Priests are given the option to wear rose-colored vestments at Mass help on this day in place of the violet vestments normally worn during Lent. The term "rose" is used to describe this lighter shade of the color violet.






Philadelphia's Pilgrimage is a part of the global Gaza Ceasefire Pilgrimage movement. People of faith in 145 cities, in 18 countries, on every continent are walking the length of Gaza in their cities in solidarity with the people of Gaza. The Philadelphia Pilgrimage will take place over Holy Week (Palm Sunday to Good Friday). Participants will walk an average of 4 miles each day, from the Liberty Bell to Lockheed Martin. 
Day 1: Sunday, March 24, 2:00 PM, walk from the Liberty Bell to the Philadelphia Zoo – 2.7 miles.


