





THE PENNSYLVANIA ELECTION PRIMARY

Important Dates

May 5th – last day to register to vote

May 13th – last date to request mail in ballot

May 20th - Primary Election Day

Polls open 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM for in-person voting. Return your Mail-in Ballot by 8:00 PM. For more information go to www.vote.pa.gov

The complete ballot for Philadelphia County has not been finalized yet. However, we do know about state-wide judges for Commonwealth Court and Superior Court, the two Democratic candidates for District Attorney as well as candidates for City Controller.

The Committee of 70's Interactive Voter Guide gives you information about each position on the ballot and the candidates running for that position. You can read about the candidate's experience and whether they are recommended for election. Experience and information about the candidates for District Attorney and City Controller is also included. Take your time and read about these candidates. **Be informed!!**

There are also candidates for Judge of Election and Inspector of Election.

Philadelphia County has 3 ballot questions that could affect the Home Rule Charter: -Increase Minimum Spending on Housing Trust Fund Purposes Amendment (May 2025): Ombudsperson for Office of Homeless Services Amendment (May 2025): Prison Community Oversight Board and Office Amendment (May 2025)

HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS

Every May, the Administration for Community Living (ACL) leads the nation's observance of **Older Americans Month** (OAM), a time to recognize older Americans' contributions and highlight aging trends.

The 2025 theme, **Flip the Script on Aging**, focuses on transforming how society perceives, talks about, and approaches aging. It encourages individuals and communities to challenge stereotypes and dispel misconceptions.

The words we use shape our perceptions.

This Older Americans Month, we're sharing ways to rethink how we talk about aging. Instead of "She still drives," simply say, "She drives." Phrases like "still" often reinforce ageist assumptions. Small shifts like this can have a big impact.

Aging is an opportunity, not a limitation—whether it's pursuing a new passion, giving back to the community, or redefining expectations.

Ever heard someone blame forgetfulness on a "senior moment?" It reinforces the stereotype that aging means cognitive decline. Let's recognize that minor memory lapses happen to people of all ages. Small language changes help us Flip the Script on Aging.

Learning doesn't stop with age—it evolves. In fact, adults over 60 are among the fastest-growing group of online learners. Let's celebrate the pursuit of knowledge at every stage of life. What new skill or subject are you exploring?

Physical activity is key to staying healthy at every stage of life. Whether it's yoga, dancing, hiking, or daily walks, movement helps maintain strength and independence. This Older Americans Month and beyond, let's challenge the idea that aging means slowing down.
