

We welcome our guest speaker, **Philadelphia Fire Commissioner Jeffrey Thompson.** A native Philadelphian raised in Germantown. He attended The Murrell Dobbins Career and Technical Education High School and Penn State University. Commissioner Thompson earned a BS in Emergency Management from Thomas Jefferson University.

Commissioner Thompson joined the Philadelphia Fire Department in 1989 as a member of Cadet Class 162. He has worked at stations all over the city during his 35 years; serving more than two decades as a Firefighter in North Philadelphia. He rose to through the ranks to become a Lieutenant, Captain and Battalion Chief with Engine 50, Ladder 12, and Battalion 8. He has also held the positions of Executive Chief; adjunct instructor at the Fire Academy; Special Investigations Officer; Deputy Fire Commissioner of Planning and 1st Deputy Fire Commissioner of Operations.

The Philadelphia Fire Department has been a part of Commissioner Jeffrey's life since he was a child. His father served as a firefighter, retiring in 1988 after 25 years of service. Commissioner Thompson is married and has two adult daughters.

We also welcome Philadelphia Police Commissioner Kevin Bethel, who is worshiping with us this morning.

The GFS presented a "Friendly Flow" on Saturday, May 10, 2025.


Their first-ever poetry slam. The girls began with a few collaborative activities (murals and poetry), followed by a phenomenal Open Mic for members.
