


If you were offended in any way by words expressed, please accept my apology on behalf of this community of faith.

Celebrating the Life of Octavius V. Catto

OCTAVIUS VALENTINE CATTO (1839-1871) was a celebrated student at the Institute of Colored Youth (ICY) Philadelphia's premier high school for African-American youth, now Cheyney University. He returned to his alma mater as a teacher and an administrator. Catto led a contingent of ICY students to Gettysburg to

fight Confederate General Robert E. Lee but black men were not allowed to enlist, When President Abraham Lincoln authorized the recruitment of black Union soldiers, Major Catto helped lead the effort. A talented athlete he played shortstop and served as Captain of the all-black Pythian Base Ball Club. By 1869, Catto was a St. Thomas Vestryman and served on the parish finance committee. He was active in the Banneker Literary Institute and broke the color bar becoming the first black member of the Franklin Institute. A leader of the National Equal Rights League, Catto spearheaded the effort to desegregate streetcars and win the vote for black men. He was assassinated on Election Day, October 10, 1871. Octavius V. Catto was remembered as a "Martyr to the cause of Constitutional Liberty."





CREMATION AND BURIAL TRADITION

From earliest times, people have been concerned about their final earthly resting place, often with concern that it be near the gathering place of their families. In Christian times, preferred burial space was within the Church itself where the faithful gathered for celebrating a liturgy or for a prayer service. The dual tradition of burial and of cremation was preserved in both ancient and in Christian times. More recently, consideration of the spiritual and the practical aspects of cremation and inurnment within the Church itself has led to a revival of this aspect of the tradition. When space within the Church was no longer available, the churchyard cemetery developed. Only in recent times have burial grounds, far removed from the community centers of life and prayer, (Laurel Hill Cemetery, Historic Eden Cemetery) been used.

THE COLUMBARIUM

A Columbarium is a vault with recessed metal compartments of niches for placing earthly remains after cremation. The cremated earthly remains are preserved in niches in a Columbarium fittingly designed and prepared. Each metal niche is enclosed with a protective front of wood, to which is attached a bronze identification plate for the appropriate name and date of death. The dual tradition of burial and cremation was preserved in ancient and Christian times.

The African Episcopal Church of Saint Thomas has constructed three structures consisting of 220 niches that can accommodate 440 urns along the Southeast wall in the Absalom Jones Chapel area. Eligible persons and active members of the African Episcopal Church of Saint Thomas and their families can purchase a niche. The opening date for the Columbarium was November 1996. A Columbarium Committee composed of four persons and the Parish Rector will govern and administer the affairs of the Columbarium. The Committee has established and will administer the policies and regulations governing sales, maintenance and expansions as was initially established by an 11-member task force.

Niches may be reserved by advance purchase, at the time of need, singly, or for family groups. The purchaser gets a Certificate of Ownership, which indicates a choice of niches. The Certificate entitles a person to a bronze nameplate and assurance of perpetual care. Orders and/or deposits are now being received. Selection of a niche will only occur upon receipt of final payment.



Empowering Communities Through Civic Engagement

PHILADELPHIA, PA – September 27, 2023 – The Octavius V. Catto Voter Education Ministry will celebrate and honor the life and legacy of Octavius V. Catto by encouraging Philadelphians to vote therefore empowering communities with resources in preparation for the Tuesday, November 7th General Election.

On **Sunday, October 15, 2023,** the voter education ministry will celebrate and host community educational events focused on the voting process and highlight Octavius' legacy, exemplified daily by his statue on the southwest corner of City Hall. Our activities include: educating the congregation of St. Thomas and the community; updating voter registration information; and demonstrating how to fill out a mail-in/absentee ballot correctly. According to WHYY, between 2014 and 2022, Pennsylvania saw a 19.5% increase in voter turnout among 18-29 year-olds. The Catto Ministry will also empower young voters with activities to encourage them to get out and vote.

Philadelphia Mayor, Jim Kenney will make remarks to support local civic engagement. Pat Christmas of the Committee of Seventy will also be in attendance to support the activities and the importance of voting.

The African Episcopal Church of St.Thomas Octavius V. Catto service and celebration begin at 10 a.m. After-service events and activities will be held in Anderson Hall and Absalom Jones House, 6361 Lancaster Avenue, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.






