

BIO: THE REVEREND DR. DAWRELL RICH, Ph.D

The Rev. Dr. Dawrell Rich, Ph.D is a pastor, educator, and public speaker whose work explores the intersection of faith, justice, and sustainability. He serves as Pastor of The River of Life Christian Church in Elizabeth, NJ, and Chaplain at Church Farm School in Exton, PA.

Dr. Rich holds a Ph.D in Religion, Society and Ecology, with a research focus on urban Black religious environmentalism. He has presented nationally and internationally, including at Oxford University's Symposium on Religious Studies and the Urban Futures Symposium in Switzerland. He is a member of the American Academy of Religion and the Association for the Sociology of Religion. In 2019, he received the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Social Justice Award from Drew University and is widely regarded as a thought leader and catalyst for change.

In addition to his ministerial and academic work, Dr. Rich serves as Director of Educational Activities for the Zeta Iota Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. In his free time, he enjoys traveling, art exhibitions and house music.

REALM CONNECT CONVERSION COMPLETE

As a reminder St. Thomas went through a system conversion this year. Realm Connect is an updated solution for the management of our ministries, stewardship, media, communications and church events calendar. The staff will use Realm Connect to perform administrative and accounting tasks.

Church Online Giving

GIVI is no longer available for online contributions. Realm Connect has taken its place. 
