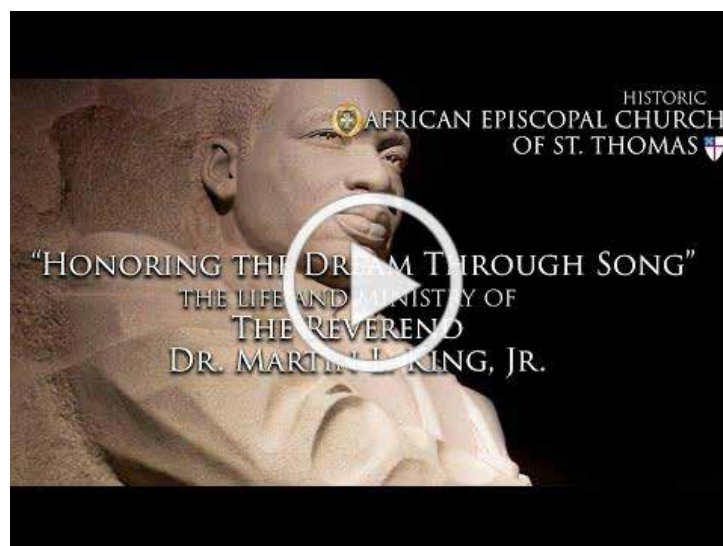

GFS Senior Peyton Miller

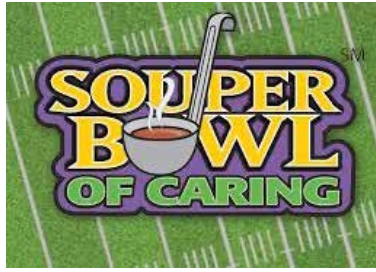
Peyton Miller is an 18-year-old lifetime member of the Girls Friendly Society and of St. Thomas Church.

REALM CONNECT CONVERSION COMPLETE
