





AECST HEALTH MINISTRY

What is the average American woman's risk of developing breast cancer during her lifetime?

Based on current incidence rates, 12.9% of women born in the United States today will develop breast cancer at some time during their lives. This estimate, from the most recent SEER Cancer Statistics Review (a report published annually by the National Cancer Institute's [NCI] Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results [SEER] Program) is based on breast cancer statistics for the years 2015 through 2017.

This estimate means that, if the current incidence rate stays the same, a woman born today has about a 1 in 8 chance of being diagnosed with breast cancer at some time during her life. On the other hand, the chance that she will never have breast cancer is 87.1%, or about 7 in 8. For men born in the United States today, the lifetime risk of breast cancer is 0.13%, based on breast cancer statistics for the years 2015 through 2017. This means that a man born today has about a 1 in 800 chance of being diagnosed with breast cancer at some time during his life.

Breast Cancer Risk Assessment Tool: Online Calculator (The Gail Model) The Breast Cancer Risk Assessment Tool (BCRAT), also known as The Gail Model, allows health professionals to estimate a woman's risk of developing invasive breast cancer over the next five years and up to age 90 (lifetime risk). The results are meant to be discussed with your health care provider.

The tool uses a woman's personal medical and reproductive history and the history of breast cancer among her first-degree relatives (mother, sisters, daughters) to estimate absolute breast cancer risk-her chance or probability of developing invasive breast cancer in a defined age interval.

The Breast Cancer Risk Assessment Tool can't predict whether or not you'll get breast cancer. It doesn't calculate an individual woman's breast cancer risk. Instead, the tool gives the average risk of breast cancer for a group of women with similar risk factors. It's not clear what this risk means for any one woman. This calculator takes about five minutes to complete. To access the Calculator to assess risk, click on this **link**.




